NAPPC RECENTLY FORMED

The North American Plant Preservation Council is a non-profit organization comprised of some of the most well known and respected names in Horticulture today.

It is modeled after the National Council for the Conservation of Plants and Gardens (NCCPG) at Wisley, England and has been formed with their assistance.

The NAPPC wishes to encourage the conservation of uncommon plants that are valuable because of their historic, aesthetic, scientific or educational value by propagating and distributing them as widely as possible and to list plants held in important collections and gardens. The organization hopes to stimulate the widest possible cultivation of uncommon and endangered plants through conferences, exhibitions, and discussions and to encourage the re-introduction and distribution of uncommon and endangered plants. They will also establish and support "National Collections" of specific genera and other defined collections of plants for the enjoyment and information of the public and the benefit of science.

The Council seeks inquiries from those parties, both private and institutional, including Botanical Gardens, Arboreta, Colleges and Nurseries who are interested in holding "National Collections." A guide will be published listing those collections.

ASP AWARDS AND GRANTS PROGRAM

ASP Research Achievement Award

The American Society of Pharmacognosy selects a recipient for the ASP Research Award annually. Candidates must be members of the Society who have made significant contributions to natural products research.

Nominations can be made at any time to the Chairman of the Research Achievement Award Committee and should consist of a letter of recommendation, a curriculum vitae of the candidate, and the names of at least three individuals who are familiar with the candidate's accomplishments. The current Chairman is Kenneth L. Rinehart, 454 Roger Adams Laboratory, University of Illinois, Urbana, Illinois 61801.

Awards and Grants for Students

To stimulate interest in all phases of natural products research, the American Society of Pharmacognosy Foundation is offering the following awards and grants:

1. ASP Student Research Award.

The ASP Student Research Award is designed to recognize outstanding research in the general area of natural products. The competition is open to all graduate and undergraduate students working for a member of the ASP. should submit a research paper describing his/her own work in the area of natural products. The applications will be reviewed by the ASP Awards and Funds Committee in a blinded competition. The research paper should conform in general to the format of the Journal of Natural Products, except that there should be no identification of the student, faculty, or school from which the paper originated. The name and address of the contestant and his/her paper title should be provided in a separate letter accompanying the paper. Please include a self-addressed stamped postcard (no smaller than 3.25 by 5.5 inches) with the title of the proposal and name of the applicant. This postcard will serve as notification of receipt of the application. The award will consist of a \$500 cash gift and all expenses paid to present the paper at the annual meeting of the ASP (restricted to meetings held in the continental U.S.).

The deadline for submission of the research paper is March 1.

2. Undergraduate Research Awards.

The ASP Undergraduate Research Awards consist of a stipend of \$2000 to the student and \$500 to the advisor to help defray the costs of the research. There are no limitations on the type of research to be conducted other than that it should be in the area of natural products. Persons interested in submitting an application for consideration should send the following before March 1.

a. An outline of the research to be conducted, written by the student submitting the application. This should include a statement of the problem and the goal(s) of the research, and a brief discussion of the methodology. This outline, with pertinent references, should not be longer than four double-spaced, typed pages.

b. A transcript of all college work attempted.

c. A letter of agreement by the faculty advisor (a member of the American Society of Pharmacognosy) for the project, indicating a willingness to supervise the project, and provide the facilities and equipment for the conduct of the project. The letter should also include a statement about the student's academic performance and suitability to perform the work proposed.

d. A self-addressed stamped postcard (no smaller than 3.25 by 5.5 inches) with the title of the proposal and name of the applicant. This postcard will serve as notification of receipt of the application.

Although not an absolute condition of the awards, students selected are highly encouraged to submit results of their research for presentation at an annual meeting of the ASP.

3. Lloyd Library and Museum Travel

This grant program was established in cooperation with the Lloyd Library and Museum. In keeping with the Lloyd Library's interest in promoting student activities, two \$500 travel awards to attend the national ASP meeting will be awarded. These awards will be made based on excellence in both scholastic and research activities in the field of natural products. Application can be made by submission of a short (2-3 pages) synopsis of the work to be presented and a letter of recommendation from the advisor. Applications are due April 1.

4. Travel Grants for Graduate Students.

Graduate students under the supervision of a Society member are eligible for a travel grant of \$300 to \$500 to enable them to attend a Society meeting and

present a paper. Application can be made by submission of a short (2-3 pages) synopsis of the work to be presented and a letter of justification from the advisor. All awards are contingent on the acceptance of the paper for presentation by the Scientific Program Committee. Applications are due April 1.

Awards and Grants for Active Members

1. Research Starter Grants.

ASP small research grants from \$2000 to \$5000 are available for active members in the first five years of their career. These are one-time awards and are not subject to indirect costs. Application can be made by submission of a research proposal of no more than four doublespaced, typed pages. A budget should accompany the proposal and the investigator should also provide a statement of his current funding. curriculum vitae of the investigator should be included with the proposal and budget. The deadline for submission of application for these grants is March 1. Please include a self-addressed stamped postcard (no smaller than 3.25 by 5.5 inches) with the title of the proposal and the name of the applicant. This postcard will serve as notification of receipt of the application.

2. Travel Grants for Active Members.

Travel grants are available to enable active members who are in the first five years of their career to travel to an American Society of Pharmacognosy meeting and present the results of their research. These awards of \$300 to \$500 are made on a competitive basis. Application can be made by submission of a short (2-3 pages) synopsis of the work to be presented, a curriculum vitae and a letter of justification for the request. All awards are contingent on the acceptance of the paper for presentation by the Scientific Program Committee. The deadline for submission of applications is April 1. Please include a self-addressed stamped postcard (no smaller than 3.25 by 5.5 inches) with the title of the proposal and name of the applicant. This postcard will serve as notification of receipt of the application.
